Introduction

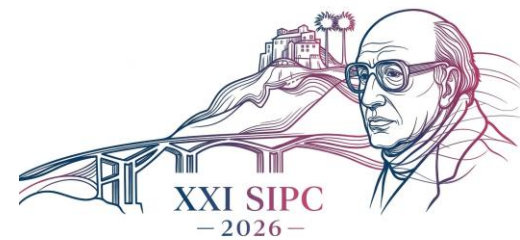
In 2026, the International Symposium on Civilizing Processes (SIPC) celebrates 30 years of its trajectory, which began at the State University of Campinas (UNICAMP) in 1996. Over these three decades, SIPC has established itself as an important space for academic dialogue, bringing together researchers from different fields of the Humanities and Social Sciences in Brazil and Latin America, centered on Process Sociology and the theoretical contributions of Norbert Elias. In its 21st edition, the event will be held at the Federal University of Espírito Santo (UFES), reaffirming its commitment to strengthening academic networks, promoting the internationalization of research, and disseminating Eliasian thought. The event is coordinated by the research group “Policies, Management, and School Inclusion: Contexts and Social Processes (GRUPGIE)” at UFES, represented by Professors Reginaldo Célio Sobrinho, Edson Pantaleão, Euluze Rodrigues da Costa Junior, along with a large organizing team.

Purpose of the Event

The 21st International Symposium on Civilizing Processes aims to foster scientific exchange and interdisciplinary debate on civilizing processes within the Humanities and Social Sciences, taking as its reference the work of Norbert Elias and his interlocutors. It seeks to strengthen national and international research networks, as well as to promote the production and dissemination of knowledge grounded in memories that narrate modes of resistance sustained by plural experiences.

Objectives

-To provide a space for theoretical and methodological deepening of research grounded in Figural Sociology;



- To foster interdisciplinary dialogue among researchers, faculty members, and undergraduate and graduate students from Brazil and abroad;
- To encourage the scientific development of early-career researchers;
- To expand interinstitutional and international research networks;
- To promote the publication of scientific outputs from the event;
- To contribute to the internationalization of UFES and its graduate programs.

- Keynote lectures and roundtables;
- Interinstitutional panels and workshops;
- Oral presentation sessions;
- Publication of digital proceedings;
- Cultural and academic integration activities.

Between 5,000 and 10,000 characters (including spaces);

Structure: introduction, methodology, analysis and discussion, final considerations, and references;

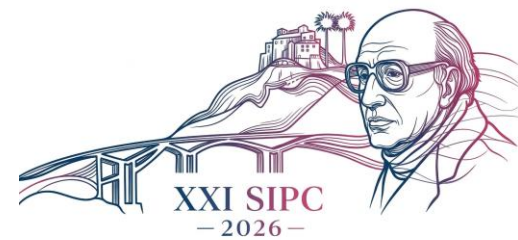
ABNT standards;
